Re: Addendum to the Sahtú Land Use Plan 5-Year Review Amendment Application – Zone 39

Dear Sirs,

In response to the letter sent by the Government of the Northwest Territories (GNWT) on May 4, 2021, the Sahtú Land Use Planning Board (SLUPB or "the Board") has prepared an Addendum to its previously adopted 5-Year Review Amendment Application to rectify concerns regarding Zone 39 Do Et'q (Doi T'oh Territorial Park and Canol Heritage Trail Reserve) Proposed Conservation Initiative (PCI).

The 5-Year Review Amendment Application was formally adopted by the SLUPB on its own motion on April 30, 2020, in compliance with subsection 48(1) of the *Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act (MVRMA)*, and submitted as adopted on May 1, 2020 to SSI, the GNWT, and CIRNAC for review and approval as per subsections 48 (2) and 43 (1) to (4) of the *MVRMA*. It was approved by the SSI through a resolution on September 29, 2020 as outlined in their letter to the Board from October 20, 2020.

The recommended revisions covered by this Addendum are technical in nature and relate to the improved mapping of the Zone 39 PCI. They are based on recommendations from the GNWT's letter and are consistent with what is written in the *Sahtú Dene and Métis Comprehensive Land Claim Agreement (SDMCLCA)* and the 2007 *Doi T'oh Territorial Park and Canol Heritage Trail Management* Plan.

The Addendum to the 5-Year Review Amendment Application attached to this letter lists individual revisions to the 5-Year Review Amendment Application and their changes as they relate to Zone 39 PCI. This is to assist the Parties with the review and approval of the 5-Year Review Amendment Application, as other sections remain untouched.

Consistent with the *MVRMA*, the Board has formally adopted the attached addendum to the 5-Year Review Amendment Application on its own motion on May 31, 2021, in compliance with



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subsection 48(1) of the *MVRMA*, and is submitting it for review and approval to SSI, the GNWT, and CIRNAC, as per subsections 48 (2) and 43 (1) to (4) of the *MVRMA*.

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Addendum to the 5-Year Review Amendment Application

The following presents the changes required to the 5-Year Review Amendment Application, referencing the amendment number, the original amendment, and the proposed amendment/additional information. The correction to the boundary of Zone 39 Do Et'q Proposed Conservation Initiative results in <1 km² reduction in the area covered by the zone, while increasing the area covered by Zone 38 Mackenzie Mountains Special Management Zone by <1 km².

Please note that the difference in area covered by each zone type affected by these amendments do not affect other calculations, such as the percent of the Sahtú Settlement Area covered by the above-mentioned zones, percent of the zone being Sahtú private lands, or the oil and gas potential percentages listed in the zones' respective descriptions and tables.
